
siblings = brothers / sisters

This is Jannet's shirt.  It's ~~her~~ shirt.

This is Jannet's skirt.  It's ~~her~~ skirt.

Can + subject + verb + ?

Can I have the bill, please ?

At the restaurant dialogue

_Yes, I'd like roast chicken, please add a bottle of mineral water, please.

_Here you are. Enjoy your meal.

Expressing obligation

must + verb (infinitive)

You must sit properly !



Expressing prohibition

mustn't + verb (infinitive)

You mustn't throw food !



Asking about price

How much is + singular noun

How much are + plural noun

How much is one kilo of apples ?

How many + countable nouns (numbers)

→ How many bananas  do you eat?

How much + uncountable nouns (quantity)

→ How much water  do you drink?

How much + verb to be = price

Unit 6 : Using means of transport


How much **is** the flight ticket ?
