This is Jannet's skirt.



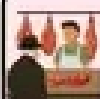
It's **her** skirt.

You **mustn't** smoke

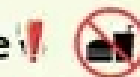


The imperative

Expressing obligation

must + verb (infinitive)

You **must** sit properly !



Expressing prohibition

mustn't + verb (infinitive)

You **mustn't** throw food



Asking about price

How much **is** + singular noun

How much **are** + plural noun

How much **is** one kilo of apples ?




How many + countable nouns (numbers)

→ How many bananas  do you eat?

How much + uncountable nouns (quantity)

→ How much water  do you drink?

How much + verb to be = price 

Unit 6 : Using means of transport

Asking about price

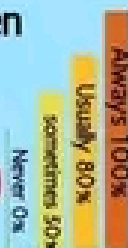
How much **is** the flight ticket ?



Adverbs of frequency

Always / usually / often
 sometimes / never
