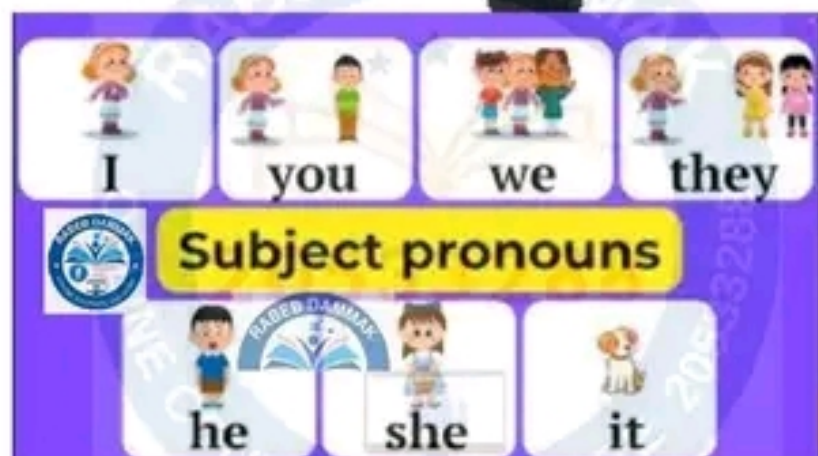

Subject pronouns



words that

**replace** nouns in a sentence to **avoid repetition**. They help make sentences clearer and more concise by replacing specific nouns with pronouns.

## Possessive Adjectives

Possessive adjectives show **ownership** or **possession** of something.  
Possessive adjectives are **used before nouns to indicate who the noun belongs to.**

### Possessive Adjectives

my	"This is <b>my</b> favorite toy."
your	"Is this <b>your</b> book?"
his	"That is <b>his</b> car parked outside."
her	"I like <b>her</b> car."
its	"The dog wags <b>its</b> tail happily."
your	"Are these <b>your</b> pens?"
our	"Let's go to <b>our</b> favorite restaurant."
their	"Those are <b>their</b> seats in the theater."
